

GRADUATE NON-DEGREE COURSEWORK  
AT THE UNM HISTORY DEPARTMENT  
(revised December, 2007)

Under certain circumstances, qualified individuals who are not enrolled in a degree program may take UNM History courses for graduate credit. The following rules and limitations apply:

1. The student must meet the minimum eligibility requirements for graduate study including a baccalaureate History or equivalent degree.
2. Either graduate seminars (500 and 600 level) or certain advanced undergraduate (300-400 level) courses may be taken for graduate credit. Undergraduate courses carrying graduate credit are listed in the University course schedule and catalogue. Ordinarily a student taking an undergraduate course for graduate credit will be assigned extra work.
3. Admission into graduate seminars (664 and above) is strictly on a space-available, instructor-approved basis. Non-degree students seeking admission to seminars must obtain the approval of the instructor. Often, availability of space may not be determined until the first week of classes
4. Generally, non-degree students who are subsequently admitted to the UNM graduate program may apply some of their credits toward fulfillment of the graduate degree requirements.
